Carl Spetzler, Strategic Decisions Group, led a workshop on the following topics:

- 1. The Fundamentals of Decision Science
- 2. Decision Quality
- 3. Organizational Decision Quality
- 4. Avoiding Decision Failure Modes
- 5. Governance and the SFERS Board Role in Organizational Decision Quality

Mr. Spetzler stated that to reach Decision Quality decision-makers must apply the following six requirements:

- 1. Appropriate frame for the decision
- 2. Creative alternatives
- 3. Relevant and reliable information
- 4. Clear values and trade-offs
- 5. Sound reasoning
- 6. Commitment to action

The workshop also included a discussion of how to best build Decision Quality into the SFERS governance model.

- The Board engages to reach Decision Quality
- The Board reviews/approves the recommendation of a committee, the Executive Director, or an advisor who is responsible for Decision Quality
- The Board has delegated the decisions and wants to stay informed
