## 4. 102120-04 Discussion Item Investing in Science, Technology and Innovation

Documents provided to the Committee prior to the current meeting: Staff Memorandum

William Coaker, Chief Investment Officer, presented an oral and written report on this item.

CIO Coaker discussed the importance of being thoughtful about where the world is going and investing in the leaders in where the world will be in the future. The era of science, technology and innovation began several decades ago, and it is accelerating. CIO Coaker stated that most investors are underestimating the speed, scale and impact of innovation, and that investors can earn significant returns by investing in the leaders in innovation.

CIO Coaker reported that science and technology investments have historically delivered high returns and that speed, scale, and impact of future innovations are underestimated. He stated that innovations over the next 10 to 30 years will be more disruptive than what has occurred until now and that science and tech are poised to continue delivering high returns. For science and technology to realize their potential of improving the human experience, responsible and responsive leadership from governments, business leaders, and philanthropists will be important.

### 5. 102120-05 Discussion Item Strategic Asset Allocation Discussion

Documents provided to the Committee prior to the current meeting: Staff Memorandum and SFERS Retirement Board Risk Tolerance Questionnaire

William Coaker, Chief Investment Officer; Anna Langs, Managing Director, Asset Allocation Risk Management, Innovative Solutions; Allan Martin and Lynda Dennen, NEPC, presented and oral and written report on this item.

Staff and consultant reviewed SFERS' current and potential Strategic Asset Allocations and presented an update of NEPC's Asset-Liability Study. Staff and NEPC presented five potential asset mixes for strategic asset allocations for the next 3 years for discussion by the Committee. Staff and consultants' presentation included a discussion of NEPC's capital markets assumptions as well as Staff's capital market assumptions. Staff's capital markets assumptions were broken down into expected returns from beta (general market or corresponding benchmark) and alpha (access return) for each asset class.

The Committee engaged in a discussion of the presentation with staff and consultants.
