> Anna Langs, Managing Director, Asset Allocation Risk Management, Innovative Solutions, provided an oral and written report providing the summary of SFERS use of leverage in fiscal year 2023/24 (FY2024) and since inception. The use of leverage added marginally to returns while providing significant operational flexibility in rebalancing and liquidity management.

In FY2024, SFERS enhanced Leverage Policies and Procedures, refined guidelines for leverage monitoring and accounting, and introduced a Leverage Policy Benchmark of 1-Month Secured Overnight Funding Rate (SOFR) + 35 basis points as part of the Asset and Liability Study. SFERS Staff will continue to strengthen portfolio risk and analytics for monitoring leverage and will evaluate alternative leverage implementations.

Level Equity Growth Partners VI, L.P. and Level Equity Opportunities Fund 2025, L.P. Under its delegated authority, SFERS invested \$55 million in Level Equity Growth Partners VI, L.P. and \$20 million in Level Equity Opportunities Fund 2025, L.P. The investments closed on September 18, 2024.

The funds will be classified as Growth Equity within SFERS' Private Equity portfolio.
